Subject: Clarifying the scope of the Product under Consideration (PUC) and Product Control Number (PCN) methodology - Anti-dumping investigation concerning imports of Biaxially Oriented Polyamide (BOPA) Film originating in or exported from China PR and Thailand

1. The Designated Authority initiated an anti-dumping investigation concerning imports of Biaxially Oriented Polyamide (BOPA) Film originating in or exported from China PR and Thailand vide Notification No. 6/38/2026-DGTR dated 24th June 2026.
2. In the initiation notification, the Authority invited comments from all interested parties on the scope of the Product under Consideration (PUC) and the proposed Product Control Number (PCN) methodology. Subsequently, vide communication dated 14th July 2026, the time for filing comments was extended up to 23rd July 2026.
3. The Authority received comments from the interested parties as well as the Domestic Industry. The submissions have been duly examined.
4. Upon examination of the submissions made by the interested parties, the Authority has decided to retain the scope of the Product under Consideration as defined in the Initiation Notification. Accordingly, the Product under Consideration is as follows:

“3. The product under consideration is Biaxially Oriented Polyamide (BOPA) Film.

4. The product under consideration is also commonly known as BOPA Film, Biaxially Oriented Nylon (BON) Film, BOPA Nylon Film or Nylon Film. BOPA Films are high-performance specialised flexible

packaging films manufactured from polyamide resin through biaxial orientation technology. It is known for its high mechanical strength, isotropic properties, odour and aroma resistance, hot and cold forming resistance, moisture and oxygen barrier properties, and puncture resistance. BOPA films have different thicknesses ranging from 12 microns to 30 microns.

5. The product under consideration is used as specialised packaging material for food, liquids and pharmaceutical products. In the pharmaceutical industry, it is used as a component in blister foils in combination with PVC and aluminium foil for packing tablets, capsules and other medical products. It is also used for packaging products such as edible oil, frozen foods, ketchup, retort products and dairy products. Further, it is used in packaging household and personal care products such as detergents, shampoo, shower gel, liquid handwash, dishwash and similar liquid and semi-liquid products.

6. The unit of measurement considered for the present investigation for the product under consideration is Metric Tons (MT).

7. The product under consideration is covered under Chapter 39, Heading 3920 of the First Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act, 1975, under tariff items 3920 92 19 and 3920 92 99. The customs classification is indicative only and is not binding on the scope of the present investigation.”

5. This communication is limited to clarifying the scope of the product under consideration for which the present investigation is being conducted. This does not preclude interested parties from providing relevant information and evidence to substantiate their requests for exclusion for any particular product. The Authority shall decide the scope of the product under consideration for any measures recommended, after considering relevant information and evidence furnished by all interested parties during the course of the investigation.
6. After examination of the submissions made by the interested parties, the Authority has decided to adopt the following Product Control Number (PCN) methodology for the purpose of the present investigation:

Parameter	Code	Description
Thickness	T12	12 Microns
	T15	More than 12 but upto 15 Microns
	T20	More than 15 but upto 20 Microns
	T25	More than 20 but upto 25 Microns
	T30	More than 25 but upto 30 Microns

7. All interested parties are requested to file their questionnaire responses and all subsequent submissions by adopting the above Product Control Number (PCN) methodology latest by 28th August, 2026.
8. All interested parties are advised to ensure that both confidential and non-confidential versions of their submissions are filed on the SETU Portal within the extended timeline, in accordance with the applicable Trade Notices.
9. Since the trade remedy investigations are time-bound in nature, no further extension of time will be granted for filing the Questionnaire Responses.
